Seud Blademir Turcios-Arrazola pled guilty to illegal reentry of a previously deported alien following an aggravated felony conviction. He was sentenced to 33 months in prison, which was within his advisory sentencing guidelines range. After Mr. Turcios-Arrazola filed this appeal, the government moved to enforce the appeal waiver in his plea agreement. In response, Mr. Turcios-Arrazola conceded the
