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**ORDER AND JUDGMENT\***

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Before **KELLY, HARTZ, and HOLMES**, Circuit Judges.

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Charles Thunehorst’s sole issue on appeal is a challenge to his sentence. His opening brief, submitted on November 1 and filed on November 19, 2010, argues that the district court improperly construed 18 U.S.C. § 924(c)(1)(A).

On November 15, however, the United States Supreme Court rejected the same argument in *Abbott v. United States*, 131 S. Ct. 18 (2010). Mr. Thunehorst

concedes in his reply brief that *Abbott* “squarely rejected claims identical to those made by Thunehorst in this case.” Aplee. Reply Br. at 1.

Accordingly, we AFFIRM the judgment below.
